

RWTH Aachen University

Module M05 of the EECI International Graduate School on Control 2023 takes place at RWTH Aachen University. With more than 45,000 students, RWTH is the largest technical university in Germany. RWTH is not a classic campus university. The university and its various departments are spread across the entire city on three, soon to be four, smaller campuses. The computer science department is located on the Hörn campus.



The Super-C is one of the central buildings of RWTH. It got its name from its unusual shape, which looks like a C from the side

Course Location

The course will take place on the 3rd Floor of extension building 3 (E3) of the computer science center at Ahornstr. 55, 52074 Aachen. The newest extension offers large seminar rooms and a roof terrace with a view of the entire computer science department. Rooms 9222 and 9220 are both available for the course.



Extension 3 of the computer science center accommodates three institutes, a lecture hall and a few seminar rooms.





Aachen

Due to the border location in the heart of Europe, there are numerous cultural and architectural influences from the neighboring regions, the Belgian-Dutch area. Probably not least because of this European character - even during his lifetime Charlemagne, who made Aachen the political, cultural and spiritual center of his empire, was called Pater Europae ("Father of Europe"). Aachen is located in the border triangle of Germany-Belgium-Netherlands. In the center of the Euregio Meuse-Rhine, in a valley open to the northeast, almost all of Aachen's streams gather in the Wurm and flow to the Rur. Unfortunately, most of the rivers in Aachen flow underground and thus cannot be admired. However, Aachen has an amazing number of fountains and other water displays. In addition, the production of confectionery by well-known companies such as Zentis (jams, confectionery, fruit preparations), Lambertz (gingerbread, Printen) and Lindt & Sprüngli (chocolate, pralines) is significant. The Aachen Printen are world famous.



The historic city hall of Aachen was built around 800 AD and to this day you can experience the history of Aachen in the building.

Travel Information

Aachen does not have an airport in the immediate vicinity. The nearest airports are Düsseldorf International (DUS), Cologne-Bonn (CGN), Brussels (BRU) and Frankfurt International (FRAU). From the airport, the journey is only possible by train or car. However, Aachen is very well connected to the international rail and road network.

By Train

- From Cologne-Bonn (CGN) you can reach Aachen directly with the RE1, RE9 and the ICE.
- From Düsseldorf International (DUS) you can reach Aachen via Mönchengladbach with the RE4.
- From Bruxelles (BRU) you can reach Aachen directly via ICE or Thalys.
- From Frankfuhrt International (FRAU) you can reach Aachen directly via ICE.
- From Paris you can reach Aachen directly via Thalys.

Public Transport

Building extension 3 (E3) can be reached by public transport in Aachen via the "Heinbuchenstraße" stop. Bus lines 33, 73, 73E and the night line 4 (N4) each are stopping here. We recommend the website of Deutsche bahn www.bahn.de, which also supports local stops in Aachen. A corresponding app is also available: www.bahn.de/service/mobile/db-navigator





By Car

- From Cologne-Bonn (CGN) you can reach Aachen directly via the A4.
- From Düsseldorf International (DUS) you can reach Aachen directly via A46 and A44.
 - From Bruxelle (BRU) you can reach Aachen directly via E40.

Parking

Parking is possible free of charge near the computer science center. **However, NOT on the official parking lot of RWTH directly at the extension building.** Here, vehicles without a parking permit will be towed away. On request we can provide parking permits for guests. Please contact us in advance to arrange parking.

Accomodation

Aachen is a university city and virtually all activities can be done on foot, by bike or an e-scooter. You can stay in a hotel in any part of the city, but for evening excursions we recommend staying near the city's two inner rings. From here, you can reach the popular evening mile "Poststraße" and the city's various landmarks quickly. You should book your accommodation as early as possible. Also, given the short course duration, the university cannot provide student accommodation for the participants.



The best area for a hotel in Aachen is the inner rings. Within the rings, everything is within walking distance.

More Information
